The Department of Forestry and Environmental Resources at North Carolina State University is seeking PhD applicants for departmental Research Assistantships starting in Fall 2020. These assistantships are available to students concentrating in the study of forestry, wildlife, natural resources of closely related areas. For example: Forest management, Wildlife management and conservation biology, Environmental science and technology, Environmental justice, Public science, Spatial and environmental analytics, Hydrology and watershed management, Global water, sanitation, and hygiene (WASH), Natural resources economics and policy, Extension and engagement, Forest genetics and genomics, Restoration ecology, Forest health, Modeling of coupled natural-human systems, and Climate change and resilience

The annual stipend is \$24,000 plus a full tuition waiver and health insurance (student fees are not included). Applicants must have earned a Masters degree before the start of the Fall 2020 semester.
