RESPONSIBILITIES:

Assist field biologists with surveying and monitoring Columbia Spotted Frog, Boreal Toad, Least Chub, Southern Leatherside Chub, and native aquatic and terrestrial mollusks. Conducts aquatic and terrestrial surveys using a variety of sampling gears including backpack electrofishing, seines, minnow traps, various tagging equipment, and quadrats. May assist with sportfish and June Sucker surveys as needed. Maintains equipment and assists with analysis of samples; duties may also include data entry and various other related tasks.

Start and end dates are flexible and ideally begin in late February/early March and run through September 2022.

QUALIFICATIONS:

Applicant must be 18 years of age or older and have a valid driver's license at time of employment. Applicants should have enthusiasm, a solid work ethic, the ability communicate, and work safely both independently and as part of a team.

Applicants must be able to:

- Lift heavy objects up to 50 pounds
- Hike off trail 5+ miles/day with a backpack in marshy and/or mountainous terrain
- Willing to work in all weather conditions
- Work 10-12 hour days

Some surveys in remote areas will involve overnight stays and could involve camping. Background in biology/ecology is desired. Experience conducting aquatic surveys is desired. Experience with Microsoft Excel preferred.

Beneficial but not required skills include: mechanical inclination, operation of 4 wheel drive vehicles, GPS operation, and experience using ArcMap 10/ArcGIS Pro.
