ENVIRONMENTAL STUDIES MINOR REQUIREMENTS (18 credits)

The Environmental Studies minor is open to all majors *except* those in the College of Natural Resources. However, this minor *is available* to students enrolled in the Geography major. Students wishing to minor in Environmental Studies should contact the Department of Environment and Society to meet with the department’s designated minor advisor. All courses required for the minor must be taken on an *A-B-C-D-F* basis. A grade of *C-* or better is required for all courses taken to meet the requirements for the minor. A minimum GPA of 2.5 is required for courses taken to complete the minor.
